

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity where we recognize the Trinity of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Last week at Pentecost the Holy Spirit came down tangibly on the disciples and the Blessed Mother as they gathered in Jerusalem after the ascension of Christ into heaven. The Spirit sent from God as another advocate gave them the courage and the strength to go out into all the world and proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ. All but one of the disciples who experienced this outpouring of the Holy Spirit suffered greatly and eventually were martyred for their belief in Christ and profession of the one true faith. The second person of the Trinity, Jesus Christ, came to this earth born as a child in His humanity and suffered and died upon the cross in the fullness of His human nature. We can see in scripture accounts concerning the life of Christ, that the Spirit was always present and seen by the disciples and others at the most important events in the earthly ministry of Jesus. The Holy Spirit that came down on the disciples at Pentecost is still very much present in the Church today. Whenever the Cardinals gather in Rome to elect a new Pope they process into the Sistine Chapel singing "Veni Sancte Spiritus (which translates to Come, Holy Spirit) to call down the guidance and power of the Spirit in their discernment of a new leader for the Church. The liturgical color, and the one most frequently associated with the Holy Spirit is red, which is often used and worn at the celebration of Confirmation. This red that Cardinals are clothed with shows, as an outward sign, that they are willing to shed their blood if required in defense of the Catholic faith and the Church. Let us continue to pray this week that the Holy Spirit will come with power upon our new collaborative and be with us in this time of financial difficulty. Our parish bears the name of the Holy Trinity, let this serve as a strong reminder to all of us to continue to work together and be one in the Lord. Through our active participation and prayer, we can be a stronger and greater example of the love of God to all we encounter. May God bless you this week!
