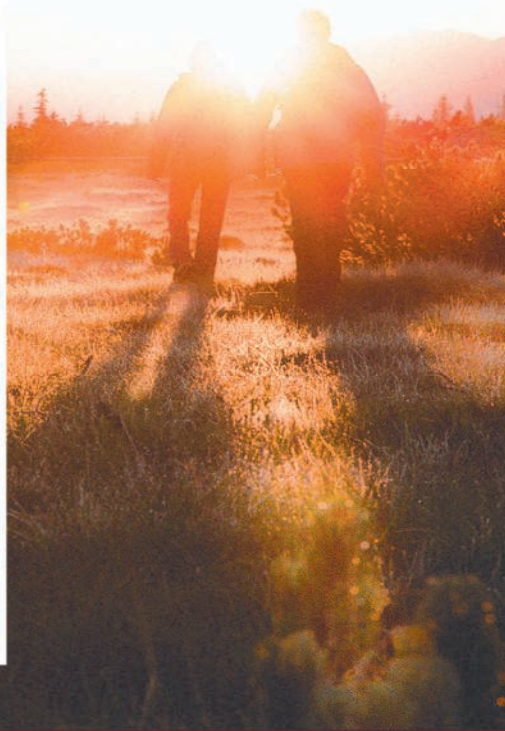

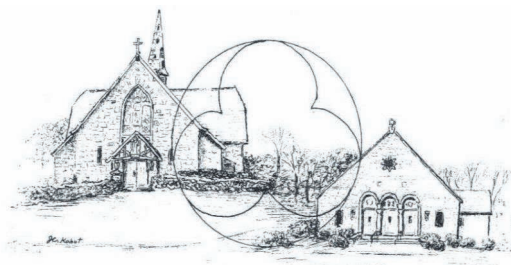

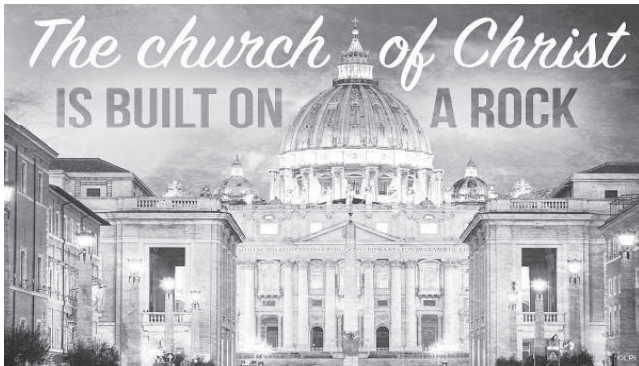

"Our Gospel account this weekend is the cornerstone of what we as Catholics believe, that Jesus Christ truly is the Son of God and also that St. Peter is given the command and instruction by Christ Himself to lead and govern His Church on earth. The purpose of Christ asking the disciples, "who do people say the Son of Man is?" is for them to articulate what they have heard others say about Him. In our own world today we can call to mind many false prophets and those we have heard of who claim outrageous things that have no basis in truth. Only Simon Peter spoke the truth to Christ when he said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." This serves to distinguish the words of men and the true words of God the father, who had revealed this truth to Peter. He is given the authority to lead the Church in the name of Christ. This Catholic belief in the apostolic succession from the time of St. Peter is essential, each valid Pope can trace their lineage directly back to Peter Himself, and Christ who gave him the authority over the Church. Without this belief and trust in the teachings from the Pope and the bishops, everything falls apart. We have to basis for faith in the Church without the authority of the Pope and the divinity of Jesus. Christ proclaimed that He was indeed the divine Son of God, no other religion in the world has a founder that claimed to be God incarnate. Let us be Catholics who are not afraid to speak the truth in our belief in Jesus Christ. Even in times of great difficulty and hardship, let us proclaim to all we encounter His presence and saving love! May God bless you this week."- Brian Kirby
