



Message from Father Martin Financial Challenges

“Next week we kick off the Grand Annual Collection Campaign. Once again, I ask that you please be as generous as you can. Until we can grow our number of parishioners we will be struggling. The challenge is not an easy one: how to bring people back to the practice of their faith. We all know people who may be on the fence as to their faith. Perhaps a friendly invitation with a witness to how important your faith is to you, will help bring more to the table of the Lord. In order to justify two churches, we need a certain number of people to pay the expenses of having two churches. The people are certainly out there, we need not look far. Our religious education families, those with school age children could be enough to fill our masses and require another mass at each church, if we could make them into disciples. It is what we will be focusing on for years to come. At the same time, we need to deal with the reality that the flow of people is not coming in, but exiting the church, as our culture becomes more and more secular. Only God knows how it will end, but we have reason for hope if we work together to evangelize our neighbors. As we enter into our “disciples in mission” training you will hear more about this exciting new initiative. Until we start to see the fruits of our work, we will be struggling financially to survive. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" These words from the Gospel account remind us that being a Catholic and a true follower of Jesus Christ has never been easy, even during the time Christ walked on this earth. We hear right before this an exchange between Jesus and Peter where He admonishes Peter for thinking like men and not like God, and also calls Him Satan. This is not an attack against Peter but a reminder to all present and listening that the things of God and the ways of God are beyond what human minds can fathom. Christ would have to suffer and die upon the cross for our salvation, and many of His disciples and early followers would be martyred for their faith in Him. In a world filled with comfortable ways of living and easy ways to do things, we must be true to the example Christ sets before us to take up our cross and follow Him. There is not but, or sometimes, or only under a certain set of circumstances. In all that we do and all that we are, we must follow Jesus Christ the king! Only in Him and in His Church can we find true salvation and be prepared to greet Him at the end of the age in our glorified bodies. Serve the poor, step outside of your comfort zone, be men and women of service and of love. We must seek to let His light and life shine through out very example, it is only through our own witness that we will bring our friends and neighbors back to their Church and reshape the world in which we live.
